

The 2019-20 school year is off and running and we have had a great start! We have a lot to celebrate and look forward to this year.

Our enrollment continues to be healthy. In a time when rural schools are seeing declining enrollment, Janesville has seen unprecedented growth in the past several years. When we certify our enrollment in the coming days we believe we will have 396.2 students. What is more exciting is what is happening in our early childhood. We began the school year with 67 preschoolers, which is 18 more than last year! Our total first day enrollment (pk-12) this year was 8 students higher than the first day of school in 2018-19.

The beginning of the school year marks the half way point of our construction project. While construction has caused disruption, we are excited at what our campus will look like by the end of the school year.

Area A, the elementary classrooms, are completed and being used by 2nd-3rd graders. There are some cosmetic things to the exterior that need to be completed, but the majority of the work is complete. The teachers have commented several times about how nice these new spaces are.

Area B, the middle school and preschool classrooms, will be completed by Christmas and ready for use after break. This will include three new middle school rooms and

two new preschool rooms.

Area C, the high school rooms and gym, will be complete in the spring. The weather has not been kind to area C which has delayed the completion date somewhat. However, we are able to see the outlines of the space, and are excited about what these additions will provide for our district once they are complete.

Character Growth

WORK HARD • BE NICE

In a nutshell, these four words may sum up what we expect from our Janesville students. We believe that in order for our students to be successful, they need both a strong academic foundation and well-developed character strengths. In order to consistently emphasize & monitor the important values

that will allow our students to be successful, we have developed a Character Growth Card.

The Janesville Character Growth Card will provide an opportunity for teachers, parents, and students to have meaningful conversations around the development of character. We want to celebrate students who consistently do the right things and

help all students improve their character strengths in order to be the best they can be. The Janesville CSD model will focus on 4 main areas: Attitude, Effort, Preparation, & Respect. The behaviors provide a meaningful window into an individual's character and a roadmap for character growth – both for students as well as their teachers.



Students will earn character growth marks every 9 weeks that will appear on their report cards and transcripts. Similar to a four-point letter grade scale, Janesville will use the following 4-point scale to assess students' character growth in the areas of attitude, effort, preparation, & respect.

- 4 = DISTINGUISHED (91-100% of the time)
- 3 = PROFICIENT (67-90% of the time)
- 2 = DEVELOPING (34-66% of the time)
- 1 = EMERGING (0-33% of the time)

We are focusing on character strengths vs. character traits because a character trait is often seen as set in stone. Character strengths, on the other hand, can be nurtured and developed. We believe character strengths can be developed over time through practice and positive feedback. As parents, your role is crucial. Although academics are important, please help support our efforts by emphasizing the "other side" of the report card. As the list to the right clearly shows, there is no excuse to not WORK HARD & BE NICE!

I listen to other people's ideas and feelings before I talk. I try to see things from their point of view and am confident in voicing my opinions too.

6. SYNERGIZE

I work well in groups and value other people's strengths and differences. I seek others' ideas to solve problems because I know together is better.

7. SHARPEN THE SAW

I take care of my mind, body, and spirit by creating balance in my life. I spend quality time with others and find meaningful ways to care for myself.

Welcome to the Janesville Child Development Center!

For children 3 years of age by Sept. 15 and potty trained, there are two options:

- ♦ M, T, Th full day (8:10-3:15). They have preschool in the a.m. and extended care in the p.m.
- ♦ M, T, Th preschool only in the p.m. (12:00-3:15)

For children 4 years of age by Sept 15 and potty trained, there are two options:

- ♦ M-F full day (8:10-3:15). They have preschool in the a.m. and extended care in the p.m.
- ♦ M, T, TH preschool only (8:10-11:30)

The timeline for registration is:

Sept-May: Open to children in the Janesville School District, children currently enrolled, and any children who are open enrolled to the district.

May-June: Open to siblings of children currently or previously enrolled.

June 1: Open to everyone.

♦ The registration fee is \$45.00.


- ♦ 3 Year Old Preschool (M, T, Th afternoons 12:00-3:15): \$120.00 a month
- ♦ 3 Year Old Preschool with extended care 8:15-3:15:

 \$240.00 a month
- ♦ 4 Year Old All Day Preschool 8:10-3:15: \$225.00 a month.
- ♦ 4 Year Old Preschool Only (8:10-11:30): Free
- ♦ The 4 year olds get a grant from the State for 10 free hours of preschool a week.

If childcare is needed between 6:45-8:05 a.m. and 3:15-5:30 p.m., we have a latch key program. You are charged a block rate for each hour the service is used. 
