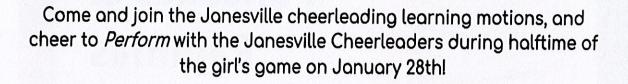

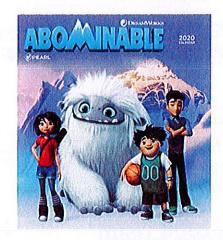

Welcome to the Janesville Preschool!

For children 3 years of age by Sept. 15, there are two options:

♦ M, T, Th full day (8:00-3:15). They have preschool in the a.m. and extended care in the p.m.

♦ M, T, Th preschool only in the p.m.

(12:00-3:20)

For children 4 years of age by Sept 15, there are two options:

♦ M-F full day (8:00-3:15). They have preschool in the a.m. and extended care in the p.m.

♦ M, T, TH preschool only (12:00-3:20)

The timeline for registration is:

Sept-Oct. 1: Open to children in the Janesville School District, children currently enrolled, and any children who are open enrolled to the district.

Oct. 1: Open to Everyone

♦ The registration fee is \$45.00.

♦ 3 Year Old Preschool (M, T, Th afternoons 12:00-

3:15): \$155.00 a month

♦ 3 Year Old Preschool with extended care 8:00-3:15:

\$255.00 a month

♦ 4 Year Old All Day Preschool 8:00-3:15: \$250.00 a month.

♦ 4 Year Old Preschool Only (12:00-3:20) Free

♦ The 4 year olds get a grant from the State for 10 free hours of preschool a week.

If childcare is needed between 6:45-8:00 a.m. and 3:15-5:30 p.m., we have a latch key program. Ms. Horstman is the contact person for this program.

November is Healthy Skin Month

Your skin is your body's largest organ, therefore it's important to know how to properly care for it! Check out these common myths about caring for your skin:

Hot water is good for your skin. Myth! Your skin has natural oils and moisturizers that are stripped away when you shower in hot water, which can leave your skin dry and itchy. Your face is particularly sensitive to hot water, so make sure to use warm water when washing it.

It's okay to pop pimples. False! While there are some fairly safe at-home techniques to get rid of whiteheads, it's generally best to avoid popping your pimples. The skin can be damaged from popping pimples and allows debris to get deeper into your pores, which causes further problems.

It's normal for moles to grow in size. Nope! If you notice a mole growing larger, or new moles popping up, it's important to get them checked out by a doctor or dermatologist. For the most part, moles will not grow in size.

Only the sun causes skin cancer. Myth! Any source of UV exposure can cause skin cancer, as well as genetic factors and other medical causes.

You can't sunburn when it's cloudy. Wrong! As much as 80% of the sun's UV rays are able to go through clouds, and you're more likely to sunburn on these days because you aren't expecting the sun. It's important to wear sunscreen, no matter the forecast, if you plan to be outside for an extended period of time.
